

What a difference a week can make! Last newsletter I shared a prayer for people impacted by Cyclone Gita and also for our friend James who was receiving medical support for his failing kidney. James is now out of hospital and even attended an afternoon session at school on Wednesday.

We were so proud of our school community for getting behind the sausage sizzle and mufti day last week – raising \$1000. The family are so appreciative of this and wanted to pass on their sincere and heartfelt thanks. James was more concerned about the playground, wanting to donate a portion of the money back to the school to help with rebuilding it.

The Playground! As you are aware last week our school was at the centre of a senseless and selfish act of arson, followed by a break in and minor vandalism of our After School Care building. This was very emotionally draining, frustrating and/or scary for students, staff and reading social media responses a large number of people in our community.

There was an upside to this as it showed what a great community and city we live in. Every school in Upper Hutt made contact with us, some even providing morning tea, chocolates and flowers. At a Principals' conference I attended a spokesperson from the Ministry of Education even passed on their thoughts.

We also received letters, cards and offers from schools to use their playgrounds while our one is out of action. These gestures went a long way to making our students feel supported and made this bad experience into a positive one. I was extremely proud of the positive responses from our community, but also in the way our own students carried themselves during this time. They came together as one, cared for each other and showed a great deal of resilience.

These things don't just happen by chance, it shows the culture of our school is changing towards one of togetherness, just like the old village proverb says – "It takes a village to raise a child". 2018 is one of change and one for the better in our school and community.

Kia Ora for all the support and blessings received during this time. Your words help with the healing.




In **2015** it was decided that a priority for all Upper Hutt schools, in order to achieve our vision, was that of student engagement. Last Thursday and Friday lead teachers and Principals met to review and build on our strategic plan for 2018. We will again be holding professional development sessions after school for all teachers shortly and as per previous years they will be forming professional learning groups based on the areas of practice they want to develop. These areas branch out from the core focus of student engagement and agency which led one of our group to coin the new uniquely Upper Hutt phrase “*Engagency*”

We also had a representative from the Ministry come to speak with us around our project and the documentation we shared with them. They were incredibly complimentary about the work we are doing and talked a lot about the “richness” of the collaboration and the “depth of capability that was home-grown”. They were also impressed by the trust and transparency shown by the cluster when sharing data and practice to identify trends and work together on solutions and celebrate success.

Part of our strategic plan is to ensure we keep our community informed of the fantastic stuff our students, teachers and leaders are doing across our cluster. We are incredibly proud to be in such a collaborative, hardworking and innovative cluster and we know our kids across the valley are benefiting from the dedicated and united approach to student well-being, achievement, engagement and outcomes.

## Religious Education Corner:

### Gospel Reflection from the Third Sunday of Lent:

#### Anger in the Temple John 2: 13-25

In Sunday's gospel reading Jesus was angry because His Father's house had become a market place, filled with people buying and selling, instead of being a place of prayer and respect. Jesus told the people that he could destroy and then rebuild the temple in three days. The people thought Jesus meant the actual temple building but Jesus meant the temple of His own body which would be destroyed by death on the cross but raised to life again after three days. As we think about Jesus cleansing the temple, we should also think about some other cleaning that we may need to do. The season of Lent is a time to look inside ourselves and see if there is anything in us that needs to be changed. Ask yourself are there some areas of your life where you need Jesus' help to do some 'spring cleaning'?

### Integration of Religious Education at St Joseph's School:

At St Joseph's School, Religious Education is interwoven and integrated across a variety of learning areas. By delivering Religious Education this way, we are able to provide a rich programme that is suitable to the individual child's age, faith development and experiences. Programmes like this, also allows our children to grow in their knowledge and understanding of the teachings and beliefs of the Catholic Church.

### So what does Religious Education look like in the Middle School?

This term, learners in the Middle Syndicate are learning about themselves as individuals. Through our integrated unit Turangawaewae - Our place to stand, learners are able to look closely at who they are, where they come from, and identify what is important to them.

While learning about who we are, learners will also begin to understand that we are all made beautifully in the image of God.

This term, we are also looking at how God's presence and action in the world is expressed in various cultures. To enable the learner to experience and witness God in other ways, students have been exploring other methods of praying, from personal prayers that we are writing ourselves, right through to mandala prayer, or meditation.


